
About Make Music Day

Make Music Day is a worldwide celebration of music that takes place on 21st June every year. It is an entirely open event where anyone who wants to can take part - young and old, amateur and professional, and all genres of music are welcome. There are really only three rules to be part of Make Music Day:

Make Music Day UK's ambition is to establish the 21st June as a national and international celebration of music making in the UK. As an open-access event promoting free performances, Make Music Day UK encourages music making in the widest variety of spaces, providing an outstanding opportunity to showcase the breadth and diversity of music making in the UK to national and international audiences.

How it all started

In October 1981, Maurice Fleuret of the French Ministry of Culture, laid the foundations for a new concept:

"MUSIC WILL BE EVERYWHERE AND THE CONCERT WILL BE NOWHERE!"

The vision was to create a day where free, live music would be everywhere: street corners and parks, rooftops and gardens, store fronts and mountaintops. Unlike a typical music festival, anyone and everyone would be invited to play music or host performances on the summer solstice, June 21, and it would be called Fête De La Musique.

Forty years on and this concept has now spread around the world with more than 120 countries celebrating Make Music Day.

Highlights 2022

Return to Live

After two years where Make Music Day took on a different for due to the pandemic, it was graet to see live music taking centrae stage once again at Make Music Day with 85% of events being performed live. We still enjoyed some imaginative online contributions such as a 24 hour Bach-athon featuring the complete organ works of Bach in 24 hours and the release of a songwriting video created the Edinburgh International Festival and Goodtrees Neighbourhood Centre.

Great Music Places

We looked for some towns and cities prepared to go that extra mile and bring their musical community together for a real celebration of music. Darlington brought together Durham Music Service, Darlington Hippodrome, The Forum Music Studios and Creative Darlington to create a great celebration of music making in Darlington. Wells Rocks worked with Wells Cathedral, Wells Cathedral School, The Blue School, Strode College and Portway Music School for their Make Music Day offering. The Business Improvement Districts in Crawley and Glasgow West End both created exciting new Make Music Day events in their localities and there were further all-day events in Chelmsford and Retford.

Let the Children Sing

After two years where there have been precious few collective music making opportunities for young people, it was a pleasure to see a number of large-scale singing events being presented across the country. These included a Royal Scottish National Orchestra led event in Paisley Abbey, the Richard Shepherd Foundation in York Minster and Nottingham Music Hub bringing together 433 children from 18 schools for their Big Sing in the Albert Hall, Nottingham.



Going Live

Make Music Day hosted it's own live broadcast 'dropping in' on events all over the UK. From Musicians in Exile in Glasgow to Backchat Brass in Middlesborough and Hermits at the Shed in Brentwood over 630 musicians took part in our four-and-a-half-hour broadcast showcasing the range and breadth of Make Music Day activity nationwide.

Global Livestream Broadcast

Make Music Day UK took part in a global live broadcast in 2022 with fourteen groups taking part in a two hour live stream from the UK. In total the day involved fourteen hours of music from Australia, India, Cyprus, Nigeria the UK and the United States broadcast in partnership with the streaming platform Volume.com.



A World of Folk

With Make Music Day taking place in so many countries across the globe, each with their own unique folk music traditions which we want to share and celebrate on Make Music Day. We invited musicians from across the world to take part in a Global Folk Challenge by swapping folk songs. Participating musicians or groups shared a folk song from their country or region, and in exchange, learned and performed a different folk song submitted by another participating musician or group. The songs were then performed and shared on Make Music Day.

Make Music Day UK - A New Era

Since 2017 Make Music Day in the UK has been managed by Making Music - The UK's organisation for leisuretime music. Following extensive consultation with key stakeholders, it was decided to create a new independent organization to run Make Music Day to enable the event to develop it's own identity and engage with the broadest possible range of stakeholders. Make Music Day 2022 was the first event run by the new organization.
